The eTwinning project successfully connected students from Italy, Georgia, Poland, Türkiye, and Romania to explore identity, combat bullying, and dismantle social labels. Our college was a collaborative partner in this project.

Through enthusiastic cross-border collaboration, students developed vital intercultural awareness, digital competences, and European citizenship. Leveraging a variety of digital tools—including Padlet, quizzes, escape rooms, infographics, and collaborative videos—participants sharpened their critical thinking, creativity, and responsible online behavior.

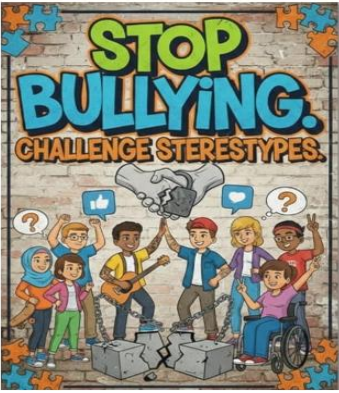
To maximize impact, the results of the “Stop Bullying and Break Stereotypes” project were widely shared with the school community through targeted communication initiatives. Regular updates, photographs, and key milestones were published on the school, teachers and parents’ groups, keeping families and community members actively informed.

A major highlight was the final online meeting, which brought together all partner schools to present their collective outcomes. Captures and summaries of this collaborative event were showcased during the parents meeting to document the experience and celebrate the students' engagement.

Furthermore, the project’s methodology including the digital tools and collaborative strategies used was shared internally with other classes and faculty members. These dissemination efforts successfully promoted best practices in bullying prevention and underscored the immense educational value of eTwinning projects in fostering inclusion, respect, and positive social behavior.
